WashU Olin alumnus Austin Hollo, BSBA 2007, is the inaugural recipient of the United Way Miami Next-Gen Philanthropist Award for his work with the organization. <u>The award</u> recognizes leaders 45 or younger who have made significant contributions—financial, organizational and volunteer—to the United Way's mission and vision. It was introduced to celebrate the Miami organization's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Hollo was honored for contributions that include his work with the United Way Miami Board of Directors and Young Leaders Executive Committee.

Hollo is a third-generation leader in <u>Florida East Coast Realty</u>, a Miami real estate development firm. As chief operating officer, his responsibilities include development, strategic marketing and evaluation of the company's real estate acquisitions.
